DISINFECTING DAMP MOP

Tools Needed

- · Wet Floor Sign
- Clean Mop
- Mop Bucket and Wringer

Product Needed

P&G Pro Line® Disinfecting Floor Cleaner



FREQUENCY OF CLEANING: Daily or more often depending on soil levels.

PREPARATION: Collect all tools, equipment and products required. Ensure all equipment is operational. Review MSDS, product labels and caution statements. Choose appropriate safety equipment.

SPECIAL DIRECTIONS FOR THIS TASK: To damp mop, start with clean mop head and fresh solution. Clean least soiled areas first. Empty mop bucket, clean and return equipment to storage area when finished. Remove wet floor sign only when surface is thoroughly dry.





STEP 1

 Remove grit and loose soil on finished floor surfaces following the <u>Dust Mop Procedure</u>.
On non-finished or grouted floor surfaces use a broom or brush.



STEP 2

• Put out wet floor sign in area to be mopped.



STEP 3

- Fill 4 gallon mop bucket to fill line with warm water.
- For water hardness up to 250 ppm, add 4 ounces of floor cleaner.
- For water hardness up to 400 ppm, add 5 1/3 ounces of floor cleaner

NOTE: Proper dilution of cleaning solution for water hardness up 250 ppm is 1 ounce to one gallon of water. Proper dilution of cleaning solution for water hardness up to 400 ppm is 1 1/3 ounces to one gallon of water.



STEP 4

 Place mop in solution and move mop up and down until mop is thoroughly wet.



STEP 5

• Lightly twist mop in wringer, leaving enough solution in mop to thoroughly wet floor.



STEP 6

 Starting at farthest point from door, mop a 10 ft. by 10 ft. area.



STEP 7

 Move to next 10 ft. by 10 ft. area, working towards doorway and repeat Step 4 through Step 7.

NOTE: Change mop bucket solution when it becomes dirty and after every use.



STEP 8

- To disinfect heavily soiled surfaces, repeat Step 4 through Step 7.
- Surface must remain wet for 10 minutes.
- Allow surface to air dry.

NOTE: Change mop bucket solution when it becomes dirty and after every use.

NOTE: Remove wet floor sign only when surface is thoroughly dry.
