BASEBOARDS

Tools Needed

- Properly Equipped Dilution Center
- Wet Floor Sign
- Clean Mop
- Mop Bucket and Wringer
- Long Handled Scrub Brush
- Squeegee
- Utility Bucket
- Non-Abrasive Pad

FREQUENCY OF CLEANING: Once per week or as needed.

SPECIAL DIRECTIONS FOR THIS TASK: Start with clean mop head and fresh solution. Change solution in mop bucket when cold, dirty, or when suds are gone. Empty mop bucket when finished. Clean mop heads daily. Change mop head as needed when it becomes permanently soiled or worn.

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STEP 1

· Fill Mop bucket with Floor cleaning solution from Dilution Center.



STEP 5

· Continue Step 4 until the entire baseboard is cleaned.



STEP 2

• Fill a clean utility bucket with warm clean water from sink.



STEP 3

• Put out wet floor sign in area to be cleaned.



STEP 4

 Dip long-handled scrubbing brush into mop bucket. Immediately remove brush and start scrubbing the baseboard in a back and forth motion until clean. Frequently re-dip the brush to make sure that the tile is thoroughly wetted with cleaning solution.

NOTE: Continue this process for 10-15 feet.

NOTE: If baseboard is heavily soiled or stained, dip the non-abrasive pad into cleaning solution and scrub area until clean.



STEP 6

· Rinse the cleaned baseboard by pouring clean water from the utility bucket onto the baseboard tile or brush with fresh water from utility bucket. Make sure all of the cleaning solution is removed.

NOTE: If a water hose is available you can rinse the cleaning solution off of the baseboard with the hose instead of using the utility bucket.

STEP 7

· Pull excess solution to a central location and pick up with a damp mop.



NOTE: If a drain is available, pull excess solution down to the nearest



floor drain using a squeegee.



STEP 8 · Wash hands before returning to service area.
