

HAND WASHING

Tools Needed

- Paper Towels
- Dedicated Handwashing Sink
- Warm Water
- Hands Free Waste Receptacle

Product Needed

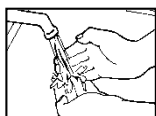

FREQUENCY OF CLEANING: After using the restroom, when starting a work shift, after breaks or eating, between handling raw and ready-to-eat foods, before putting on disposable gloves, after touching bare body parts or hair, after coughing or sneezing, after handling soiled equipment or utensils, after handling anything that might contaminate food.

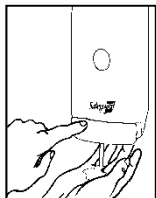
SPECIAL DIRECTIONS FOR THIS TASK: After using restrooms, hands must be washed in restroom and again when returning to work area using the hand wash sink in that area.

NOTE: If you are using a towel dispenser with a crank or lever, roll down towels before starting to wash hands to avoid possible contamination after washing.



STEP 1

- Use warm water to wet hands.



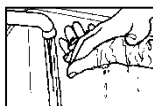
STEP 2

- Apply Safeguard Hand Soap to hands.



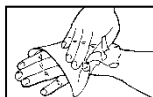
STEP 3

- Work Safeguard Hand Soap into a lather.
- Wash between fingers, under fingernails, up wrists and exposed portions of the forearms.
- Wash for a minimum of 20 seconds.



STEP 4

- Rinse with clean water.



STEP 5

- Dry with paper towel.
- Use paper towel to turn off water.
- Discard towel without touching waste receptacle.
